

From the Pastor





If the Son sets you free, you shall be free indeed!

John 8:36

Martin Luther was beset with the question of "How do I know God has accepted me?" or "How does one please an angry god?" Luther discovered in the scriptures and later confirmed by the events in his life, and the work of the Holy Spirit that God has given to all who will receive it, an alien righteousness. It is a righteousness that comes not from oneself but is a gift, given by God! It is a gift through the work of Christ on the cross. It is received by faith. Faith is not just a hoping or a belief system that works like exchanging cash for goods. But faith is the looking to another for help, support, and acceptance.

Then comes the Good News or Great News, that indeed Jesus can be dependent on 100%. First Jesus had incredible compassion for those who wanted relief from true guilt, or for those tired of playing the religious game of rules to qualify. Jesus did not come to condemn anyone but to invite them into his forgiveness and fellowship with him. Jesus still comes to us that way. We live in the time of grace, but there will be a time when that day is over, and we will have to give an accounting for our lives. Luther tried to teach that it is impossible for us to please God. That we cannot bargain with God nor ever convince our inner self that we are okay with God. Our only path to freedom is to put ourselves completely in God's hands, to put our trust in God.

Luther was so over joyed in life to put his faith in the cross of Jesus. This was most important, what Christ did, not what we do. To receive it as a gift that we could never accomplished. Luther knew this was real freedom. Martin Ludder was his name, and he changed it to Luther to express the Greek word for freedom, elutherius.

Elutherius was the Greek word from Galatians..."It is for freedom that Christ has set us free!" Christ frees us from the power of sin, of condemnation, or shame, of guilt.

We often think that freedom is do to what one wants to do, but for Luther that would be a sad joke, to belief in that rubbish. For what we truly want to do is part of being in bondage, Luther knew and understood that sin drives and has power over people. Luther teaches us the Son alone makes us free. This Sunday October 29' we celebrate 500 years since the nailing of the 95 Theses and the sounds of real freedom. The Word of God is needed now more than ever in life.

Guilt and shame are powerful tools that still work on people. People use them to control others and end up destroying lives. People are still bought and sold in all parts of the world as property, as slaves, and worse. Powers of sin still stir up rumor, slander, and anger. As the world has silenced the Good News in the media, darkness and guilt have crept in to take over. Know today that because of the cross of Christ you are forgiven, you are His, and he is faithful. Despite how the devil or someone may accuse you, and they may be partly right, it does not matter, Christ has come and He has said "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

Take time today to thank God for your Savior, Jesus. Trust him with everything. At first it is difficult, but with each step you grow in confidence in Him, and know His freedom!




October COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS




Exercising our gratitude muscles

Expressing gratitude isn't just a good thing to do; it also appears to be good for us! Indiana University researchers found that participants who performed gratitude-focused

writing exercises felt uplifted, and were more likely to express gratefulness through generosity, even weeks later.

Furthermore, brain scans revealed increased gratitude-related activity even months down the road (New York Magazine).

Though the study was small, we seem to have a "gratitude muscle" that can be strengthened through exercise. If so, there may be more than we thought to the popularity of gratitude journals and Mom's insistence that we write thank-you notes. Not to mention the biblical call to "give thanks to the LORD, for he is good" (1 Chronicles 16:34, for example).



Might God have hardwired us for gratitude — not only at Thanksgiving but year round — because it's good for *us* as well as for those we thank? To that, we respond,

"Thanks be to God!"
