




HOW MANY PEOPLE READ THE NEWSLETTER?

Financial Update for Christ Lutheran

Please take time to Read!!!

Our latest financial report to the church council shows we have received \$147,164 for January thru August. In 2016 our giving thru August was \$181,000. In our giving for the year we had



hoped, we would be at \$187,000 thru August. Though many of our weekly reports in the bulletin have been very good recently, but there were many weeks last winter and this summer where we fell short. Up through June our expenses were lower than usual, and we were keeping up. As we go through the year the expenses have overtaken our giving, we are currently \$18,000 to \$21,000 in the red. Our proposed expenses for the year in the budget are \$190,080, we have spent \$169,000.

We set a goal of \$280,000 in offerings for the year. The congregation and the church council has focused on what our mission is and doing it, but we can only keep doing that if the funds are available. As a congregation trying to rebuild and renew itself, it is a long haul. It is not something that we can change quickly. We continue to pray and seek that God will provide what God desires us to have, and we pray for your partnership to support the ministries of Christ Lutheran Church.

October Benevolence-The Dwelling Place

The Dwelling Place is a Christian ministry providing healing and hope to victims of domestic abuse through supportive services and a safe place to call home.

The Dwelling Place is a Christian ministry providing healing and hope to victims of domestic abuse through supportive services and a safe place to call home. The Dwelling Place Values identify their core values and guiding principles for all operations and relationships of the ministry. The Dwelling Place exists to break the generational cycle of abuse by equipping and empowering women through the love of Jesus Christ so they can experience lasting freedom.

The Dwelling Place provides transitional housing for up to 12-18 months to women and their children escaping abuse. This length of time is necessary to allow women to focus on accomplishing their goals by engaging in the programs The Dwelling Place offers. Our programs assist women in ending the generational cycle of violence and equip them to live empowered successful lives supporting themselves and their children.

The Dwelling Place offers support in many ways through counseling, education and assistance. The Dwelling Place also works to be a catalyst for change in the community. They provide education about the dynamics of abuse and the effect it has on the community.

Community Service and Civic organizations

The backbone of The Dwelling Place is their volunteer program. Volunteers assist The Dwelling Place in every area of operation. Without volunteers, The Dwelling Place would not have their current facilities or many of the vital support services that they offer to their residents.

LOVE OUT LOUD MUSICFEST 2017!

The word of God was spread all throughout Maple Plain and beyond with all who attended from near and far at the 2017 Love Out Loud Concert, featuring The Afters, Jason Gray and David Dunn! You could literally just feel the Spirit flowing over the crowd, with the music and testimonies of these incredible artists.

The counting/estimate is at least 800 people were in attendance! Oh if we could know about all of the seeds that were planted, the spirits that were stirred, and relationships with Jesus that were started or strengthened! Our Facebook site had over 200 likes and 2000 visitors. Our free face-painting never had a line less than 5 deep, soooo many kids and smiles! The Bouncy House was never empty.

The Live on Forever Tour's main sponsor is the Prison Fellowship Ministry. The call was made about this ministry while Jason Gray highlighted it. There were 17 Sponsorships that were signed up for/completed during the concert by those in attendance! That comes out to over \$7000 for their ministry which was a great success.

The ladies from the Maple Plain Historical Society were able to raise almost \$500 selling ice cream! They are trying to raise approximately \$30,000 to construct a new building for their museum (replica of old). See Joann Ree for more on their efforts.

The Christ Lutheran Youth raised approximately \$325 selling water and pop. Yeah Youth!


CHARIS WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY
