The LUTHER 2017 Study! Faith that is Real in a Real World!

On October 31, 2017 it will be the 500th Anniversary of the nailing of the 95 Theses to the church doors of a little village in Wittenberg, Germany, by an unknown monk, named Martin Luther. Luther turned out to be the center of a cultural European re-awakening of God's word, of faith and freedom. The ordinary person in Europe became empowered in their faith and in their work. To this day, Luther is still a controversial person, but the events of his life, and his teachings are impressive. Some people today are choosing to leave Luther in the past! What did Luther help us to see and use for life, for faith, for work and for freedom.

We are offering an all adult study this fall, it meets five times on Wednesdays at 6:30 to 7:20pm. This is in place of our normal Wednesday Women's and Men's Bible studies, which will return in November. This is a five week session and we will introduce the weekly study at the Sunday Morning Adult Discussion time and then dig deeper and apply it to our lives on Wednesday evenings. This is not one of those studies that will get bogged down in the history or information, but if the truth sets one free, then let us share it to live free! It will be applying the discoveries of the Reformation to our faith life, to our church, and to our families!

You can come to just the Sunday discussion but I hope you will find the Wednesday session growing deeper a real life empowering time for your life. We will use a brief guide, some video, the Bible, and discussion.

- Week 1 Sunday September 17 and Wednesday September 20 The Re-discovery off the Priority of Grace, God Loves you! God loves You!
- Week 2 Sunday September 24 and Wednesday September 27 The Re-Establishment of God's Word. Good seed always bears good fruit!
- Week 3 Sunday October 1 and Wednesday October 4 The Freedom of a Christian and Direct Access to God. The Holy Spirit is for you!
- Week 4 Sundays October 8 and October 15 and Wednesday October 11 The Reality of the Two Kingdoms in this Real World. Snowballing your trust in God!
- Week 5 Sunday October 22 and Wednesday October 25

The Voice of Lutherans in the Whole Christian Church today. The Truth will set you free!

With God there are many blessings. The truest blessings are of those, where we desire to love and serve Him more than anything else. What a joy to know that His kingdom never ends and that it grows. The joy to know we have a place in his kingdom and with working with each other is great. We have shared God's blessing this year with joy and generosity! Thank you we say to each other and to God.



For the month of July our offerings were \$19,933.77 into the general fund, our goal is \$23,300 per month. The total general fund for the year is at \$127,303.43. By averaging the monthly giving to date we should have \$142,000. But we figure there is a bit of a summer lag. The assets for the church in savings, checking, and endowments is up \$14,923.82 for the year. We have been able to operate in the black almost all year, but that changes as we go through the summer. We are depending on the return of fall worshippers and regular giving for making up for the year. Our total spending to date for the general fund is about \$140,000. There are other expenses for the cemetery, youth mission trip, property etc., that have our year to date total expenses at about \$160,000. Over all the total assets for the year are up \$14,900. To date they are \$517,000.

We have also shared in many gifts beyond the general budget, the Youth Mission Trip, Love Out Loud Music Festival, the Maple Plain Food Shelf, and more. Thanks for being a giving congregation.

Our Annual Meeting this year will be Sunday November 12. The proposed budget will be available November 5. The 2018 budget will probably be very familiar to the 2017 budget, with the exception of adding on expenses for our youth director.

News from the Furnishings Committee-Upgrading our Coffee Area

Over the summer the Furnishings Committee took an honest look at the need to make the fireside room more inviting and more efficient in hosting people. The people on the committee are Pat Olson, Dee Anderson, Karen Grandstrand, Delores Peterson, Kayla Dudzinski, Yvonne Breeschoten, Brad Sim, and Pastor Ron Boettner. They took time to study how other congregations use and design their spaces.

It has been a fun adventure and a learning opportunity. Many ideas were thrown into the process and everyone get coming together on similar ideas. It was very positive. Most church entries have a welcoming area with comfortable neutral furniture, walls

are light but not white, adding warmth. There is good signage for rest rooms and direction to other rooms. Gathering points like bistro tables and coffee islands were very helpful. The Furnishings Committee has done some great work this

summer and hopefully will be able to put the plan into action soon.

The church council is making a special appeal to ask for donations for chairs, bistro tables, end tables, and a coffee island. The property committee has already increased the lighting in the room by adding more recessed lights and switching over to LED lights. The total cost is about \$10,000. The new chairs, love seats, and bistro tables are about \$5,000 and the coffee Island, refurbishing the built in buffet, and adding a flat screen television is about \$4,600. To date we have already received \$1,300 in gifts



Hi there, dear friends!

I pray you are all enjoying your summer! I just wanted to drop in and share what I have been reflecting on lately. Maybe it could be helpful for you, too. I have been thinking a lot lately about the power of compassion. Because our lives are constantly busy, it can be easy to neglect the needs of both others and ourselves. Sometimes our lives get so busy that we forget to take time to actively listen to one another's stories without thinking of the next thing that we need to get done. I have been on the receiving end of that and I have also been the one not truly paying attention to the other person.

Compassion, genuine compassion, is given and cultivated when we take the time to honestly embrace our humanity and show empathy to others. I have found that there is a great difference between empathy and sympathy. A person who is showing sympathy towards another person may say, "I am feeling FOR you." A person who is showing empathy says, "I am feeling WITH you. I relate. You are not alone." Empathy, I feel, is the greatest tool of compassion.

When we take the time to listen to another person's story, we are making time for connection and compassion. Jesus did the same. He also knew when he needed to take time to simply be. He was a master at caring for others while also setting boundaries. I'm trying to be more mindful of my conversations with others as well as being aware of their needs as well as my own. Am I listening with my whole heart or am I passively listening? Am I taking time to show compassion towards others or am I being selfish with my time? Is it okay to be selfish with my time right now? We were all wired for connection. I have realized that there is no shame in being honest. There is no shame in being vulnerable. There is no shame in asking for what we need. It's the beauty of being human. We share an equal humanity. And we need each other.

My challenge for us all in this next month is to be more mindful of our interactions with others. What are others in need of that I can offer them? What am I in need of? Do I feel as though I can be assertive and ask for what I need? How can I give others and myself compassion today?

Compassion is something that we choose to practice. And we have the greatest example as to what that should look like. How awesome is that?




