

Financial Update of Christ Lutheran Church through October 2018:

Our giving for October was below our average for the year. The monthly offerings were \$16,970. Our average monthly offerings this year have been about \$21,222. So we are really depending on a big December. Please remember our offerings go towards sharing God's word and ministry to our community, to our members, and that our Mission partners depend on us to support their ministries.

Our expenses for October were \$18,742 which is below our average of \$23,000 in the budget. For the year we are \$10,994 in the red. That sounds tough, but it is a great improvement over the past few years. We are thankful for your help in this.

If you want to give more, here is a list of suggested items that are always welcomed and no labels required:










We will be decorating the church for Christmas this Saturday, Dec. I at 10am. No need to sign up....just show up and we will enjoy coffee & rolls afterwards!
