We may notice others are crying out for the purpose to blame someone else for the problems of the world. They may want to be helpful but only seem to be adding fuel to the fire. We may notice some are crying out to create a greater crisis of division for political power. But, all cry for the sad and hopeless atmosphere of division, pain, alienation, and lack of all recognizing our humanness and God's ability to help. God can help, and God will help. If we allow him.

As Jesus stood up to read the scroll in his home town synagogue and to share the word of God. He turned to Isaiah 61 and read..."The spírít of the sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim release to the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn..."

As we hear that text, we ought to realize the power of its words. No person other than Jesus can heal, free, and empower people to become the true people of God! Jesus has a unique role in the world and in our lives! <u>Christ alone!</u>

That day, as Jesus read that text, he identified himself as the Savior of all, and he began to influence, change, and transform the world. He worked through just a handful of people. They knew his love, his strength, and his will to bless others. They changed the world.

As the world cries out, God hears. He cares and he will bring forth his mercy and his goodness. God's love is unrelenting, God's good will, will be done! Please do not be dismayed. Do not doubt God's ability or God's timing.

As followers of Christ, all the more He is teaching us to be his people. To be living for Him. What made the disciples powerful enough to change the world was Christ in them. As the people of God we cannot just say we are for unity, for understanding, or for cooperation we must actually live our lives as Christ did.

The prophet Zechariah cried, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord Almighty." Zechariah 4:6

May each of us invite the Holy Spirit to be Lord in our lives.

To open our eyes to who Jesus really is for this world, for each person.

Christ alone can set the captives free.

Financial Update for Christ Lutheran Church 2018


The <u>year end report</u> for 2018 showed we had received \$47,015.15 in offerings for the General Fund for December. This brought our total giving to the General Fund for 2018 to \$267,817.84. The total expenses of the general budget was \$265,585.78. This show we were in the black but actually we are caring over a benevolence payment into 2019 and that will be reflected in our 2019 budget. So basically the year ended up very close to even.






