

A Vision of the Vision Team's Vision

After our May 18th workshop with Tracee Swank and Church Doctor's Ministries, one of the workshop attendees shared from her devotional a vision of the plan of the Vision Team. This was written by Jonathon Kahn.

"One of the schools gardens was more of a small field than a garden. It was enclosed with a stone wall and filled with grass and wildflowers of every color. As we were walking through it the teacher bent down and picked a purple lily. "You know" he said, "Messiah spoke of these. He said the lilies of the field, how they grow, they neither toil or spin; and yet I say to you that Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these.' He was speaking of the care and the provision God gives to his children, comparing King Solomon in all his riches to a wildflower. And King Solomon in all his glory could not equal the beauty of a lily in the field. What does this reveal?

"If God cares enough to adorn a wildflower in the field, how much more does he care for His children."

"Yes, there is more. Solomon's clothing was the work of man. The lily in the field is the work of God. And between the two there is no comparison. It is the lily that is more beautiful, the more perfect, and the more majestic. You see the works of man are never perfect. But the works of God always are. And so perfection is not based on one's striving to produce good works. Perfection is found in the way of the lilies.

Learn their secret. Lilies neither toil or spin. They don't strive to produce the works of God. Their secret is; they are the works of God. And in this lilies are much wiser than men. A life spent trying to produce works of righteousness and holiness will never produce them...and will be focused on the source of those works...the self. But a life focused on the works of God will be focused on the source of those works...God.

So the secret is not to focus on your works for God. The secret is to become the work of God. Cease...stop the striving to do the work of God...start letting your life become His work.

Let everything you do and are begin in Him. Let your righteousness be an outflowing of His righteouness... your love the outflowing of His love, and your life the outflowing of His life. And your life will become as beautiful as the lily in the field."

Let us truly rest, and trust God with our lives. Let's believe not just in sunshine and beauty, but let us trust in Christ who has the power to give us life, rivers of living water.

As we recreate this summer let's ask God to speak his newness and brilliance into our lives, that He cares so much for.



Our current savings and checking account balance is \$93,600.


