## Advent is the Beginning of the New



#### Poinsettia Fun Fact

Poinsettia plants are native to Central America, especially an area of southern Mexico known as 'Taxco del Alarcon' where they flower during the winter.

There is an old Mexican legend about how Poinsettias and Christmas come together, it goes like this:

There was once a poor Mexican girl called Pepita who had no present to give the baby Jesus at the Christmas Eve Services. As Pepita walked to the chapel, sadly, her cousin Pedro tried to cheer her up.

'Pepita', he said "I'm sure that even the smallest gift, given by someone who loves him will make Jesus Happy."

Pepita didn't know what she could give, so she picked a small handful of weeds from the roadside and made them into a small bouquet. She felt embarrassed because she could only give this small present to Jesus. As she walked through the chapel to the altar, she remembered what Pedro had said. She began to feel better, knelt down and put the bouquet at the bottom of the nativity scene. Suddenly, the bouquet of weeds burst into bright red flowers, and everyone who saw them were sure they had seen a miracle. From that day on, the bright red flowers were known as the 'Flores de Noche Buena', or 'Flowers of the Holy Night'.

The shape of the poinsettia flower and leaves are sometimes thought as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem which led the Wise Men to Jesus. The red colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ. The white leaves represent his purity.

### **Memorial Committee**

Over the last couple of months, the Memorial Committee has been studying different needs or projects in the congregation and how to go about helping them happen. The funds available in the Memorial Fund have been sitting there and the committee has made recommendations to the church council.

Several goals were made. We wanted to have achievable projects that were both short term and long term. The recommendations for short term were;

1. New banners for the sanctuary that can also be used in other areas in the church. (\$1,200 goal). 2. Funds for the furnishing committee to use for new artwork in our hallways (\$2,000 goal). 3. A new permanel flagpole with solar lighting at our cemetery (\$3,500 goal). 4. Funds to support the celebration of our 150<sup>th</sup> Appiversary in 202

hallways (\$2,000 goal). 3. A new permanent flagpole with solar lighting at our cemetery (\$3,500 goal). 4. Funds to support the celebration of our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2025 (\$3,000 goal). The long-term goal, pending church council and congregational approval was a bell tower. The Memorial Committee had a bell tower representative give us a lot of information and what costs were about a bell tower. There were many things to consider as far as design, what the functions of the bell could do, and maintenance of the bell. Costs for a bell tower can vary from \$35,000 -\$65,000.

The church council designated the current Memorial Funds as follows; Banners \$500, Artwork \$743, and Flagpole \$1,500. There was already \$3,300 designated to a bell tower. The Memorial Committee will continue to study and work on these goals. We hope you would like to give to help us complete these projects.

# Vision Team Looking Up!

What is the church? Someone once said, "The church is what is left over after the building has burned down." The church is really the people, it is a living and breathing organism.
