

#### Our Congregational Council sets our Direction for 2020

The new year and the first meeting of the 2020 Christ Lutheran Church Council brought discussion and focus on the possibilities for moving Christ Lutheran forward in its mission. After months of reflection and discussion by the Vision Team and Church Council, over 20 different needs and possible missions were presented before the council to see where they believed our priorities were and what would be most helpful for our congregation to grow.

There was a feeling of unity and conviction about going forward now. The council members were asked to list what they believe were the top five needs and missions. They were as follows;

1. Renew our congregation by having a new bible study for all our people, that would function for a short time of 3-4 months and meet 3-4 times in host homes and/or at church. The

Bible study would be engaging and would give us a foundation for who we truly are as God's people and our mission.

- 2. Create opportunities for our younger adults (20-40) to get together for fellowship, and mission, and for making an impact on their families.
- 3. To support the Mission
  Outreach team in local ministries
  that would help us to get to
  know the neighbors in our
  community and for them to get
  to know us. For example; a
  monthly community supper and
  fellowship event, driving people
  for groceries or appointments,
  supporting and helping young
  parents.
- 4. To keep our Vision Team active and help engage the congregation to be involved in growing kingdom DNA in all we do as a congregation. Training us to be friends with our neighbors

and natural evangelists.

5. To empower our youth and their parents in VBS, Mission Trip to Puerto Rico, and the weekly and monthly youth and

children events.

There were of course other needs that were close to these top five such as; calling of new staff 1. to support music in worship with a new keyboard person as Joan retires and 2. to support parents and children with a possible intern pastor or associate pastor, as Molly seeks a full-time job in counseling after her graduation in May. There are also the interests to support the new Haven Home in its services to seniors and to supporting faith and ministry at the new Haven Home.

One of the priorities is to grow our actual relationships and membership, while not letting



## Inspiration Point Christian Camp


Dear Friends of Christ Lutheran,
