#### A Word from Pastor Wes

#### Disciple:

1- A personal follower of Jesus during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles.

The word disciple is an important word in the church. This is evident by the fact that if you look up the word in the dictionary the first definition talks about Jesus and his followers. Yet it is not just the word that should be important to us, but the act of actually being a disciple that is key in the life of a believer. Despite what the definition above says, **ALL** who enter into a relationship with Jesus are called to become his disciple. It is a call that involves a lifelong, all consuming passion for and commitment to Jesus. In other words, becoming a disciple of Jesus is not to be taken lightly, but is at the very core of our Christian life. Being a disciple has the goal of becoming more and more like the master, more and more like Jesus.

There are actually two parts to being a disciple and Jesus calls believers to both. The first, we know...to become more like Christ. Just like the disciples spending day and night for three years with Jesus, it takes time spent with Jesus and the working of the Holy Spirit for us to become more and more like him. Spending time with Jesus includes regular prayer, continual reading of the Bible, and fellowshipping with other believers. But the call of the disciples didn't end after Jesus ascended into heaven. They spent time becoming like Jesus so that they could carry out His command in Matthew 28; to go and make (new) disciples! Part of the call to become a disciple is to make other disciples of Jesus. This is how the church grew after the resurrection of Jesus, and it is how it still grows today. Normal, regular, everyday people telling others about what Jesus has done for them and how they can receive his gracious gift.

The thought of making disciples of others can be daunting and unnerving, but it doesn't need to be. A recent survey showed that of those who have been going to church for 10 or more years, nearly

90% of them were invited by a friend or family member. That means that the growth of the church is done by people like you talking about Christ to friends and family...people you already know and have a relationship with! This includes friends, relatives, co-workers, and neighbors. The reason that discipleship among this group is so successful is that you already have a common kinship, community, and interests with these people that you call friends and family. You KNOW them and they KNOW you! This is the key. Plus, it's not through our own powers of persuasion that we need to rely on. It is the power of the Gospel at work, we are merely the messengers. As Martin Luther once said, "We are all mere beggars telling other beggars where to find bread".

Jesus calls all believers to be His disciple, to become more and more like him, and to go and make disciples. Here at Christ Lutheran let us not only take the call to BE a disciple serious, but the command to MAKE disciples as well. After all, we can take *nothing* with us into heaven, but we may be able to go there with *someone* we know and love!
