mockery of God and his goodness for us. When we as Christians want to be like Jesus, when we want to do what God says is holy, there are people who like to push back hard against it. People like to say, "you cannot put that on me!"

There is always a drift away from God. We forget to put others first. We forget to not do anything out of selfish ambition. Then pretty soon we say, "Well you should do whatever feels good to you." It is funny how we have to remind ourselves to feed the hungry, to visit the sick, to befriend the stranger. We live in such times when the church looks more like the world than it looks like Jesus.

Jesus is not discouraged, nor should we be. Christ is saying I want you to grow into who I made you to be. Stay close to me, stay in my love, and you will bear good fruit. Today and this moment is a time when we can again see what

is happening, the times we are living in and we can live out of Jesus, obeying his ways. You have been given the Holy Spirit, and you can make that daily decision to live empowered by God, to live for Him alone.

There is incredible public pressure, the need for a acceptance, the fear of ridicule and rejection that are saying to the church be quiet. The church has been far too quiet. Again, God says, "Worship only me, use my name only in praise, remember to rest in me, honor your parents and those in authority, do not steal, do not lie, do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not bear false witness, do not hate your enemies, do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth...Do you want to feel God's strength? Then love your family, love your neighbor, and love your enemy. And the God of peace will make himself known to you.

Mark your calendar; you don't want to miss this great study!


The Goal of the Christian Life

The Olympics are in full swing, and if you are anything like my family that means that we are watching obsessively and cheering enthusiastically every moment of sporting events that we only care about once every four years! Synchronized diving, amazing! Olympic Triathlon, spellbinding! Air Rifle Shooting, mesmerizing! Does it get any better than this?! While you may have a different favorite Olympic sport than I do, or not care about them at all, one thing we can all agree on is that all the athletes that are competing had to set lofty goals to just get to the point of competing in the Olympics, much less actually winning a medal. Without clearly defined goals and a constant focus on obtaining those goals there is no way that any of the athletes would be enjoying the success of being in the Olympics. With no goal, there is no direction, no clear forward progress.

This led me to think about my life as a Christian, specifically what goals should those who call Jesus their Lord and Savior have. What is the purpose of life on this earth AFTER receiving the gift of salvation from Jesus? When we receive God's grace we are not miraculously taken up to heaven. No, instead we are left on this earth, so there must be a reason (and it is not just hanging on until we die, or Jesus comes to take us home). No, as we see in Ephesians 2:10, Christ has things he wants us to accomplish which he prepared in advance for us to do. So how do we find these things that we should make the goal of our Christian life? The best place we can turn to look is clearly God's word, the Bible. Let's look at just some of the things God tells us should be our goals as found in scripture.

1 Timothy 2:3,4 tells us that God's will for us is that we are saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. We were created for God's glory and to proclaim his praises (1 Corinthians 10:31; Ephesians 1:11-12; 1 Peter 2:9). It is God's plan for each of us that we "be conformed to the likeness of his Son" (Romans 8:29). Even in this life, we "are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory" (2 Corinthians 3:18). Paul labored with the Galatians "until Christ is formed in you" (Galatians 4:19). He told the Ephesians that our goal is

"attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ" (Ephesians 4:13). As people who have been liberated, our goal is to serve and live before God in holiness and righteousness all our days (Luke 1:74-75).

Financial Update for Christ Lutheran

We are thankful to God who has sent rain in due time. God knows our needs and for reasons we do not fully understand, the rain does not come as we please, but we trust Him. It is good to know our God cares and has only good reasons for all he does. As our congregation has an unpredictable life of people coming and going, of pandemic changing how we do things, so also our giving varies and changes. But we ourselves remember to be faithful to God in our giving and God we know will be doing exactly what He does, which is always good!

Our June offerings were only \$16,804. This is low even for June.

Our expenses were \$24,354 for the month. Which is normal. For the year we have received \$126,673 and have spent \$147,343 so we are \$20,175 behind. We expected to be about \$15,000 behind for the year at this time.

As we all work together on building our congregation to be in its mission for Christ we think of "What can we do?" First, we can pray for God to give us the desire to want to support His church in the world, work on our relationships of building each other up, and adjust our staffing to the ability we are able to afford. We know this is a transition time in our staffing, as

we have brought on Pastor Wes and Worship & Music Director Eric. The lead pastor's salary will go down as Pastor Wes takes on more responsibility. It will work out. But we pray for God's direction and for support of the ministries of Christ Lutheran Church.

We also thank Matt Mundahl for his work on the Church Council and for being our treasurer. He and Laura have made a new move to Wyoming. It has been a dream and passion of his to live out west. We pray God's blessings on them both and we thank them for the service they gave our congregation.

Summer of Fun (and if not fun, at least something a little different)!

Summer is a great season in the church to do something a little different and take a break from the usual routines that we all get used to and maybe need a break from. Along those lines I have started a couple of groups this summer for different populations of our church family. The families of young children are meeting together with Anya and I once a month for a young family's cookout at the parsonage (even though the first one was rained out and moved to the church)! These cookouts are a great time for parents of young children to gather for fellowship and encouragement. Raising a family is not for the faint of heart and being able to share the journey with others is a gift. Our next cookout is August 15th at 11am at the parsonage.

This summer has also seen the beginning of a young adult's group for those that have graduated from high school. This is a great way to reconnect with some of our past youth students and build new relationships with others! Meeting every Tuesday, this group is tackling what it means to be a new adult in this current culture. By tackling topics that are at the

the forefront of today's generation we look at what God requires of us and what a Christian response looks like.
