

Amazing Grace and the Season of Lent

The calendar has turned to February, and in 2023 that means only one thing to me... Lent Season is upon us! That's right, it is time to prepare our hearts and minds for the incredible journey Christ made to the cross on our behalf. In case you are wondering why February makes me think of Lent it is because this year Ash Wednesday is on Feb 22nd!

What is Lent? The season of Lent spans 40 weekdays beginning on Ash Wednesday and climaxing during Holy Week with Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday), Good Friday, and concluding Saturday before Easter. The practice of marking these 40 days before Easter has been celebrated in the church for over 1500 years.

Why 40 days? The number 40 is connected with many biblical events. God flooded the earth by having it rain for forty days and nights (Genesis 7:12). Moses was also on Mount Sinai for 40 days and nights, on two separate occasions (Exodus 24:18, 34:1 -28), receiving God's laws. He also sent spies, for forty days, to investigate the land God promised the Israelites as an inheritance (Numbers 13:25, 14:34). The prophet Jonah powerfully warned ancient Nineveh, for forty days, that its destruction would come because of its many sins.

There are other instances as well recorded in the Bible, but 40 is particularly significant during the season of lent because of the forty days Jesus spent in the

wilderness preparing for His ministry by facing the temptations that could lead him to abandon his mission and calling. Christians today use this period of time for introspection, self-examination, and repentance. Here at Christ Lutheran it is a preparation to celebrate God's marvelous redemption at Easter, and the resurrected life that we live, and hope for, as Christians.

Every year we have a theme for the Lent season that helps us focus on what Christ did for us and keeps us from just going

through the motions of marking another season of the church calendar. This year our Theme is "Amazing Grace"! 2023 marks the 250th anniversary of when former slave trader turned poet and pastor John Newton wrote the hymn to accompany a sermon he preached on New Years Day. For all who long for God's promise in the midst of grief, despair, guilt, and shame, "Amazing Grace" is one of the world's most hopeful hymns. It sings of the Good news we have in Christ and shares God's

comfort and love for his people.

After the Ash
Wednesday Service we
will be holding special
Wednesday Services
leading up to Holy
Week. During each of
our lent services we will
focus on one of the
stanza's of "Amazing
Grace" and how they
communicate the
amazing love and
promise of God to us.

The service will open with a few songs, a short devotional and then we will break into small groups where we can discuss together

the impact of God's grace in our lives, both where we have seen it at work and where we need it in our lives.
Services will begin at 6:30pm and be about 55 minutes in length.

There can be no better time to reflect on the grace Jesus bought for us on the cross than this season. Let us remember and worship Christ together this season of lent!

One of the ways we will do that is by updating Christ Lutheran of the prayer requests of our partners.

Mission Partners:

Feed My Starving Children: Wednesday, January 18th marked the beginning of the food allocation process for the quickly approaching 2023-2024 fiscal year. Please lift our entire Department of International Programs in prayer as they review the numerous applications from our partners all over the world and determine how many meals each partner will receive.

Love INC: Prayer for the winter session for our Fresh Start program that began January 16. Pray that those involved by and in need can learn new skills and set goals that will help them for life. Fresh Start is a series of weekly classes in a safe and encouraging atmosphere designed to help participants. This "transformational ministry" program is based on Love INC National's Redemptive Compassion philosophy to lend a hand up, not a handout.

Human Trafficking: World Vision offers a guide for those wishing to pray for those affected by Human Trafficking. Pray for an end to human trafficking. Pray for action. Pray for prevention. Pray for protection. Pray for restoration. Pray for justice.

Mn Adult & Teen Challenge: Pray for women in their program that have CPS (child protection) cases that need freedom from drugs/alcohol and want to be reunited with their children. Pray for the women's center opening in Brainerd and that if it could be open ahead of schedule. Pray that God will remove any barriers that people might have that would stop them from staying or coming to MnTC. Pray that God will open new doors so they can continue to spread the word about Him, addiction, and freedom in Christ.

Ministry Partners:

Lutheran Congregations In Mission for Christ (LCMC): Our association would like to encourage people to use the Lord's Prayer as an outline to pray for the congregations of the LCMC, for the leaders of our LCMC association, and for those who don't yet know Jesus as their Savior.

They are helping individuals' and families get a new drug/alcohol/chemical free start by learning to seek and trust in God's amazing grace and mercy.
